FOUNDATION YEARS
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MAY 27, 2004

Siskiyou Initiative becomes a 501c3. First Board forms.

2004

Seven pods collectively refer to themselves as the Siskiyou School.

SPRING 2019

"Closing the Circle Campaign" is launched to replace the original 2000 classroom and remodel Pine Hall.

SPRING 2006

Capital Campaign I is launched to purchase 631 Clay Street and build a campus. \$700K raised in six weeks.

SUMMER 2006

The Clay Street property is acquired. A new Board forms, Catherine Razi is hired as Administrator, and Siskiyou Initiative becomes the Siskiyou School.

1980

Light Valley Waldorf School founded in Medford. Christine Crawley is lead teacher (with inspiration from Rene Querido).

SEPTEMBER 11, 2006

Ground-breaking ceremony marks the launch of classroom construction. Tuition is standardized after Pod Years.

SPRING 2017

Aurilia McNamara is hired as Administrator.

MAY 2007

School-Warming Ceremony marks completion of first four classrooms. All classes finally on same campus! Capital Campaign II raises \$400K to build next two classrooms.

SEPTEMBER 2016

Middle School Language Arts position and Middle School Wellness Program are added. Administrative Assistant is hired.

FALL 2008

Board adds basic health coverage for teachers. Classrooms for 7th and 8th completed. Campus includes six new classrooms, a first grade room in the main building, and the original 2000 classroom.

MARCH 2016

Clay Street Garden purchased.

SEPTEMBER 2009

Board adds cost-of-living increase to salaries.

SEPTEMBER 2015

Board adds disability insurance for staff. ACORN program begins.

APRIL 2001

Siskiyou Initiative, a business entity, is formed by the Transition Group. Site search begins.

SPRING 2015

Glendale House opens for classes! Pedagogical Director position is added to support Administrator. Lisa Barry and Karl Johnson are hired as new leadership team.

1993

Light Valley Waldorf School moves from Jacksonville to Ashland and is renamed Waldorf School of the Rogue Valley.

SEPTEMBER 2010

Board adds basic dental insurance for teachers.

SEPTEMBER 2014

Glendale House is purchased and remodeling begins.

SEPTEMBER 2011

Board adds basic retirement benefit for teachers. Director of Community Development position added.

SEPTEMBER 2013

ACORN Program is funded and launched.

SEPTEMBER 2012

Ohana Program is funded and launched.

SEPTEMBER 2000

Of the 140 WSRV students, 42 continue with Waldorf in four independent "bridge" classes; 2nd, 3rd, 5th, and 7th. Tuition varies greatly. Transition Group forms.

JUNE 2000

Waldorf School of Rogue Valley closes. Christine Crawley, with permission from Pastor Ray, has a classroom built by parent Larry Medinger in back of Clay Street Church for her 7th grade (22 girls).
